While the Hospital facility has been meticulously maintained, expansions and renovations are inevitable. In the Hospital's strategic plan, begun in 2006, we estimate spending \$16 million through the period ending in 2010. Various issues from service growth to the need for modernization, has motivated the Board of Directors, Medical Staff, and Administration to implement the Campaign for Excellence. This plan will improve the technology, facilities, computerization and, therefore, the quality of care at Nathan Littauer Hospital, our Nursing Home and our eight outpatient Primary Care Centers.

With more than 24,670 people visiting Littauer's ER in 2007 (that's 67 people per day) expansion of the Emergency Department is essential.

• Littauer's ER serves as a vital entry point for the majority of the area's emergency cases. Since its renovation more than 20 years ago, critical care technology and methods have changed significantly. Our expansion and renovations will reflect those changes.

401 babies were born in Littauer's Maternity Unit. In order to continue being the community's choice to start or extend your family, the Maternity Unit needs to be renovated.

• Built to the standards of another era, the current space needs to be enhanced to reflect the state-of-the-art maternity care you receive at Littauer.

A total of 4,486 procedures were performed in our OR.

To continue to be a progressive Surgical Center, Littauer has committed to having the latest technology available to our surgeons, allowing them to do the best job possible. With an average of more than 320 people per day seeking outpatient testing we need to provide imaging equipment that keeps pace with the rate of technological advancements.










Primary Care Center Locations

Nathan Littauer Hospital Nursing Home is part of the Nathan Littauer Hospital campus. It is a short and long-term, residential health care facility that provides skilled nursing care in an atmosphere of respect and concern for each individual resident. The Nursing Home is operated by Nathan Littauer Hospital and is licensed by the New York State Department of Health. Our facility serves 84 men and women who require individualized care and skilled nursing services.

The Rehabilitation Services Department operates five days a week utilizing an interdisciplinary approach to deliver quality services to residents for short or long-term stays. Physical, Occupational, and Speech Therapies are coordinated and implemented with the goal of returning the resident to his or her maximum physical potential. Resident needs are met by our professional staff as determined by the physician. Residents are taught to safely carry out all necessary daily functions in an effort to maximize their independence and prepare them for a return to home or another appropriate setting. The department's simulation of a home environment serves to ease the transition from our facility to a home setting.

Excellence in the Community

In 2007 HealthLink provided 530 programs with 6,616 attendees.

Celebrating our 19th year, HealthLink is a visible sign of Littauer's commitment to the community. **During 2007, HealthLink operated at a cost to the Hospital of \$218,482.** This financial commitment by the Hospital has not only allowed Health-Link to exist, but to thrive.


HealthLink

HealthLink is vital in:

- increasing community awareness of the benefits of wellness
- providing a link to other Hospital and community services.
- providing free or low cost resources for those wishing to make positive, healthy lifestyle changes,

including

- 41 health screenings for cholesterol, HDL cholesterol, glucose, blood pressure, diabetes risk and women's health
- 298 wellness classes on childbirth preparation, parenting, mind/body fitness, and general wellness
- 149 work-site wellness programs
- 20 speaking engagements on such topics as managing stress, fitness, tobacco cessation, diabetes, meditation, blood pressure, humor, nutrition, and attitude
- 22 Vitality Plus programs for adults on cancer prevention, diabetes, foot care, heart health, humor, safe driving, and vision
- 12 community events reaching more than 1700 community members
- 4 special events sponsored by Health Link Littauer including a Women's Health Fair, Healthy Heart day, Women's Wellness conference and Harvest Health fair



Here are some examples:

Healthy Women's Partnership of Fulton and Montgomery Counties provided 186 clinical breast exams, 97 mammograms, and 171 pap tests to women during 2007.

Healthy Living Partnership of Fulton, Montgomery, Schoharie, and Otsego

Counties focuses on diabetes awareness and prevention education. The mission of this coalition is to promote healthy eating and regular exercise as well as sound diabetes self management practices for those who have been diagnosed. During 2007, HealthLink Littauer staff participated in 9 events reaching 186 people.

Project Action of Hamilton, Fulton and Montgomery Counties

seeks to reduce tobacco use in the three county area through education and advocacy. HealthLink is an active participant in ongoing awareness activities.



Tobacco Education and Cessation.

Working with Glens Falls Hospital as lead agency, during 2007 this initiative provided health care professionals at seven sites in Fulton, Montgomery, and Hamilton counties programming to give them knowledge and skills to support their patients in cessation. There were 9 community education programs held reaching 167 people and two provider education programs serving 19 people.



40 children attended Camp SuperStarrs, Littauer's day camp for children with chronic obstructive breathing disorders, diabetes, limited physical handicaps and eating disorders.

Since 1979, Littauer has operated this camp for two weeks during the summer. Camp SuperStarrs offers kids the opportunity to enjoy a summer camp experience under the professional guidance and care of hospital personnel. Littauer underwrites the entire expense with help from generous community donations.

100 people received diabetes education and 210 people visited the diabetes monthly support group at our Diabetes Center of Excellence.

The Diabetes Center of Excellence was established in 2003. In April of 2006, Littauer's Diabetes Center of Excellence was re-accredited by the American Diabetes Association. Littauer's diabetes education team consists of a pharmacist, nutritionist, registered nurse, physical therapist, adult nurse practitioner and social worker. The team holds monthly "recognition programs" to educate individuals through a multi-disciplinary approach. This program is the only one in Fulton and Montgomery counties with such an integrated and comprehensive team of professionals. **450 Lifeline units were installed in the tri-county area. Nearly 5,200 calls were handled by the Emergency Room during this time period.** Lifeline is a Personal Emergency Response System, which links the subscriber to 24-hour assistance at the push of a button. It allows the subscriber to move freely around one's home or yard with the confidence of knowing that if help is needed, Lifeline will call for it. Lifeline calls are answered by Littauer's Emergency Department staff.

Ten students from Fulton, Montgomery, and Hamilton counties participated in the New Visions program at Littauer. In its 11th year at Littauer, the New Visions program sponsored by HFM BOCES has been a huge success. This year long program allows academically talented, college bound, high school students to learn about the health care field by rotating through different areas and departments in the hospital. At the end of the year, each student is required to give an oral presentation to hospital employees on a medical topic.

695 adults and 1864 children in Fulton, Montgomery and Hamilton Counties were enrolled in the Child Health Plus and Family Health Plus Programs.

The Littauer Occupational Health Program served 2,169 employees of 294 local businesses. The Littauer Occupational Alliance (LOA) offers business and industry leaders a comprehensive choice of cost-effective, high-quality, and convenient occupational health services. Recognizing that no two businesses are alike, we work with each organization to design a program of services tailored to its specific needs. LOA is located at the Gloversville Primary/Specialty Care Center and the Perth Primary/Specialty Care Center; however appointments can also be made at the Caroga Lake, Johnstown, Mayfield, and Speculator Primary Care Centers.
