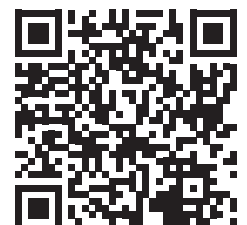

LITTAUER ADDS ENDOCRINOLOGY TO SERVICES

In 2025, Nathan Littauer Hospital & Nursing Home expanded its specialty care offerings with the addition of Endocrinology services, further strengthening access to high-quality, comprehensive care close to home for our community.

With the arrival of Dr. Reddy, a board-certified endocrinologist, patients now have local access to specialized diagnosis and treatment for a wide range of endocrine and metabolic conditions, including diabetes, thyroid disorders, osteoporosis, adrenal conditions, and other hormone-related diseases. Dr. Reddy began seeing patients in 2025 at our Amsterdam Primary Care Center (PCC), significantly reducing the need for patients to travel outside the region for specialty endocrine care.

The introduction of Endocrinology services reflects Nathan Littauer's ongoing commitment to meeting the evolving healthcare needs of our region—particularly as chronic conditions such as diabetes continue to impact our rural population at higher-than-average rates. By integrating specialty care within our existing primary care network, we are enhancing care coordination, improving disease management, and supporting better long-term health outcomes for patients.

ORTHOPEDICS UPDATE

In 2025, Nathan Littauer Hospital & Nursing Home continued to strengthen regional access to high-quality orthopedic care through its joint venture with St. Mary's Healthcare at Mohawk Valley Orthopedic Associates (MVOA). This collaboration reflects a shared commitment to expanding specialty services, investing in clinical excellence, and meeting the growing musculoskeletal needs of the communities we serve.

During the year, Nathan Littauer and its partners made significant strategic investments to reestablish spine surgery services at MVOA, bringing advanced surgical care back to the region and reducing the need for patients to seek complex orthopedic and spine procedures outside the Mohawk Valley. The return of spine surgeries represents an important enhancement to the continuum of orthopedic care available locally, supporting improved access, continuity, and patient outcomes.



In addition to expanding surgical capabilities, MVOA also focused on long-term growth and sustainability of orthopedic services. As part of this forward-looking strategy, two new orthopedic providers were recruited and are scheduled to join MVOA in 2026, further strengthening the practice's capacity to meet patient demand and support timely access to care.

This joint venture exemplifies the value of regional collaboration in rural healthcare—leveraging shared resources, clinical expertise, and strategic investment to deliver high-quality specialty services close to home. Through MVOA, Nathan Littauer remains committed to ensuring patients have access to comprehensive orthopedic and spine care, now and into the future.

LITTAUER EXPANDS INFUSION THERAPY SERVICES

In 2025, Nathan Littauer Hospital & Nursing Home continued to strengthen its commitment to accessible, high-quality care by making strategic investments in Infusion Therapy services—ensuring patients across our region can receive critical treatments closer to home, without the burden of long-distance travel for care.

Infusion therapy plays a vital role in the management of many chronic and complex medical conditions. For patients who previously faced frequent trips to larger, distant medical centers, receiving infusion services locally can make a meaningful difference in both health outcomes and quality of life. By expanding and enhancing our infusion capabilities, Nathan Littauer has removed barriers to care while preserving the personal, community-based approach our patients deserve.

Our Infusion Therapy services support the treatment of a wide range of conditions, including: Anemia, Crohn's Disease, Osteoporosis, Prostate Cancer, Ulcerative Colitis, Rheumatoid Arthritis, and more. These therapies are often ongoing and time-sensitive, requiring consistency, clinical precision, and a supportive care environment. In response, Nathan Littauer has invested in experienced clinical staff, modern equipment, and thoughtfully designed spaces that prioritize patient comfort, safety, and dignity.

Our infusion team works closely with physicians, specialists, patients, and families to ensure each treatment plan is delivered safely and effectively. Every patient encounter is guided by careful coordination, clinical expertise, and a deep understanding that infusion therapy is not just a procedure—it is part of a larger journey of care. Patients are cared for by skilled professionals who bring both technical expertise and compassion to every interaction. By investing in Infusion Therapy services in 2025, Nathan Littauer reaffirmed its role as a trusted healthcare partner for the communities we serve.

In 2025, Nathan Littauer provided 1,575 infusions to our community, reflecting a 44 percent increase from the previous year and underscoring the growing need for local infusion services.



HIGHER RESOLUTION FOR BREAST IMAGING

In 2025, Nathan Littauer Hospital & Nursing Home made a significant investment in women's health with the purchase of the GE Senographe Pristina mammography system—a state-of-the-art technology designed to enhance image quality, patient comfort, and diagnostic accuracy. The Senographe Pristina Mammography System offers several benefits for both patients and technologists at Littauer.

The Pristina represents a meaningful advancement in breast imaging. Its superior image quality allows for clearer, more detailed scans, supporting earlier detection and more confident clinical decision-making.

The system's design enables patients to be positioned closer to the machine, allowing more breast tissue to be captured during imaging—resulting in more comprehensive and accurate exams.

Equally important is the Pristina's focus on patient comfort and accessibility. The unit is quieter than previous technology and features a design that is easier for technologists to adjust to each individual. Its ability to raise and lower smoothly makes it more accessible for patients with mobility challenges, reinforcing our commitment to inclusive, patient-centered care. By reducing physical strain and anxiety during exams, the Pristina helps create a calmer, more supportive screening experience.

This investment reflects Nathan Littauer's ongoing dedication to combining advanced technology with compassionate care. By improving both the patient experience and the quality of diagnostic imaging, the GE Senographe Pristina strengthens our ability to deliver high-quality, personalized breast care close to home—ensuring our community does not have to travel far to receive exceptional, modern medical services.

BIRTHING CENTER

NARCOTIC USE REDUCED BY 67%

In 2025, Nathan Littauer Hospital's Birthing Center achieved a major advancement in maternal care through the implementation of an Enhanced Recovery After Cesarean (ERAC) program, resulting in a 67% reduction in postoperative narcotic use among cesarean birth patients. A same-year analysis comparing patients before and after ERAC implementation demonstrated significant decreases in opioid use, with many patients requiring little to no narcotic medication while still achieving effective pain control.

The ERAC program emphasizes a multidisciplinary, evidence-based approach to pain management and recovery. Key components include scheduled non-opioid medications, regional anesthesia techniques, comprehensive patient education, and consistent nursing practices that support early mobility, hydration, warming, and recovery milestones. This coordinated effort reflects collaboration among Birthing Center nurses, obstetricians, midwives, anesthesiology, nursing education, and leadership, all working toward improved patient safety and outcomes.

Patients participating in the ERAC program have experienced faster recovery, fewer opioid-related side effects, improved mobility, and enhanced ability to bond with and care for their newborns. While narcotics remain available when clinically appropriate, they are no longer the default approach. By adopting nationally recognized best practices and achieving outcomes that meet or exceed those of larger institutions, Nathan Littauer's Birthing Center continues to demonstrate its commitment to high-quality, patient-centered maternal care in a community hospital setting.

Looking ahead, the success of the ERAC program underscores Nathan Littauer Hospital's ongoing commitment to innovation, quality improvement, and responsible opioid stewardship. The program serves as a model for how community hospitals can implement advanced, evidence-based protocols that enhance patient experiences while improving clinical outcomes. As the Birthing Center continues to evaluate and refine its practices, ERAC remains a cornerstone of delivering safe, modern, and compassionate maternal care close to home.



NLH RECEIVES GREAT RESULTS ON DNV SURVEY

During the November 11–13, 2025, DNV accreditation survey, Nathan Littauer Hospital & Nursing Home demonstrated strong performance across clinical, quality, and operational standards. The organization received zero Immediate Jeopardy findings, zero condition-level nonconformities, and zero NC-1 findings, reflecting a high level of compliance with national accreditation requirements. Only three NC-2 findings, the lowest level of observation, were identified, all of which are eligible for correction and review during a future survey cycle.

Surveyors consistently recognized the hospital's quality infrastructure, teamwork, and culture of safety. Multiple reviewers noted the strength of the Quality Management System, the effectiveness of dashboards and meeting documentation, and the organization's proactive approach to corrective action planning. Staff across departments were described as collaborative, transparent, and well-prepared, with several surveyors remarking that Nathan Littauer's systems and practices exceeded those seen at much larger institutions.

The limited findings identified focused on discrete documentation and monitoring opportunities within engineering and clinical processes, rather than system-wide issues. Leadership and staff immediately began planning corrective actions, reinforcing the organization's commitment to continuous improvement. Overall, the 2025 DNV survey results affirm Nathan Littauer Hospital & Nursing Home's dedication to quality, patient safety, regulatory excellence, and accountability—ensuring Nathan Littauer remains well-positioned to serve its community now and into the future with clinical excellence!

RATHKA WINS MCKNIGHT AWARD

In 2025, Aimee Rathka, MSHSA, LNHA, Nursing Home Administrator of Nathan Littauer Hospital and Nursing Home, was inducted into the Hall of Honor as part of the McKnight's Women of Distinction awards program. This national recognition honors senior-level women leaders who have made a lasting impact within their organizations and across the long-term care industry. Rathka's induction reflects her sustained commitment to quality, dignity, and compassionate care for nursing home residents.

Rathka's leadership has been instrumental in advancing resident-centered care and strengthening the culture of long-term care at Nathan Littauer. As noted by President and CEO Sean Fadale, FACHE, her dedication to residents, staff, and the organization is evident in every decision she makes. Her induction into McKnight's Hall of Honor not only recognizes individual excellence, but also underscores Nathan Littauer's continued commitment to exceptional long-term care and leadership excellence within the communities it serves.



EMPLOYEE SERVICE AWARDS

Each year, we proudly honor our dedicated team members through our Employee Service Awards Dinner—an evening dedicated to recognizing milestone years of service and celebrating the individuals whose commitment has helped shape our organization. It is an intentional moment to pause, reflect, and acknowledge the value of continuity, experience, and institutional knowledge within our workforce.

By celebrating these milestones together, we reinforce our commitment to fostering a culture of appreciation, connection, and mutual respect—one that recognizes the dedication of those who have chosen to build their careers with us and continue to contribute to our shared mission year after year.



ICARE CHAMPIONS

Developed in 2025, Nathan Littauer Hospital & Nursing Home will launch the ICARE Champion Award next year, a new employee recognition program created to celebrate the compassion, dedication, and everyday excellence demonstrated by its staff. The program honors individuals who exemplify one of the organization's ICARE values—Integrity, Collaboration, Accountability, Respect, and Empathy—values that guide how care is delivered across the hospital and nursing home.

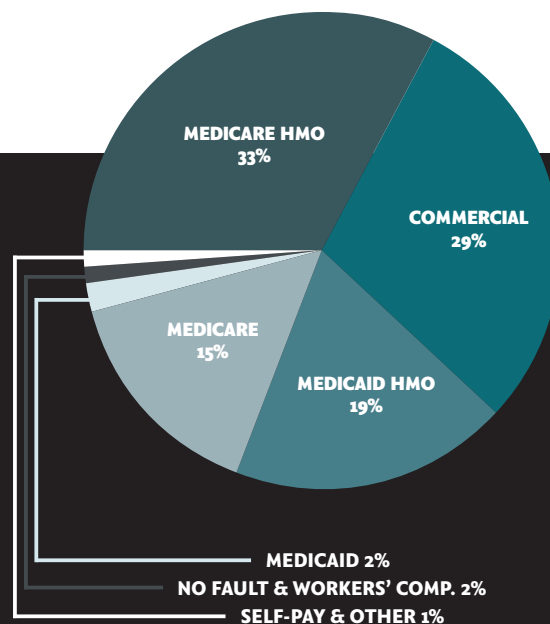
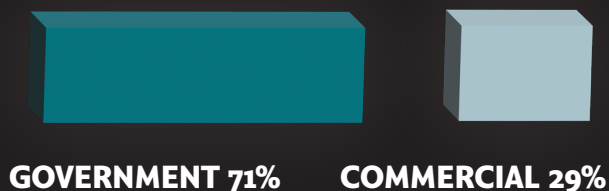

A GUIDING LIGHT: ANN'S STORY OF CARE

When Ann Trojan first arrived at the Emergency Department at Nathan Littauer, she was gravely ill.

For several days, she had tried to manage her symptoms at home—resting, hoping she would feel better with time. But instead of improving, she became weaker. By the time she came through the doors of the ER, Ann could barely breathe. It was clear she needed immediate medical attention.

Within minutes of evaluation, physicians and clinical staff determined Ann was battling both pneumonia and COVID. Her condition was critical. Her husband, Bill, remembers that moment vividly.

“Everyone treated us with the sense of urgency that saved Ann’s life,” Bill recalled. “It was very scary. I was genuinely thinking I might lose my wife.”

In many cases, patients admitted through the Emergency Department are transferred to the Medical-Surgical Unit for inpatient care. But Ann’s condition required a higher level of monitoring and intervention. Without hesitation, the care team transferred her directly to the Special Care Unit (SCU), where specialized staff and advanced monitoring capabilities could support her recovery. Ann does not remember much of those early days. She drifted in and out of consciousness, her body fighting to heal. What she does remember is the presence of her husband at her side—and the unwavering care of the team surrounding her.

For three weeks, Ann remained at Nathan Littauer, receiving intensive care, respiratory support, and around-the-clock monitoring. Among the many clinicians who cared for Ann, one nurse made a lasting impression. Karina Knaupff, a nurse in our Special Care Unit, became a steady presence during Ann’s most vulnerable moments.

“Karina was a loving and caring nurse,” Ann shared. “She didn’t sugar coat things, and she always said the truth with a smile. It was what I needed to get better.” Karina’s approach—honest, reassuring, and compassionate—provided more than clinical care. It provided Ann with strength and resolve. In moments when progress felt slow and uncertainty lingered, that steady voice helped Ann focus on healing.

For Bill, knowing someone was not only watching the monitors but also truly caring for his wife brought a measure of comfort during an otherwise frightening time. Ann’s recovery was not immediate, nor was it easy. But with skilled medical intervention, careful monitoring, and the dedication of nurses, physicians, respiratory therapists, and support staff, she regained her strength.

Today, Ann reflects on her experience with gratitude—not only for the outcome, but for the way she and her husband were treated throughout one of the most difficult experiences of their lives.

Her story is a reminder that healthcare is more than diagnoses and treatments. It is urgency when seconds matter. It is clinical expertise paired with compassion. It is honesty delivered with kindness. And it is families standing together, supported by a team that refuses to give up.

At Nathan Littauer, those values come to life every day—sometimes in dramatic moments that save a life, and often in the quiet, steady presence of someone like Karina, who becomes a guiding light in the storm of uncertainty.

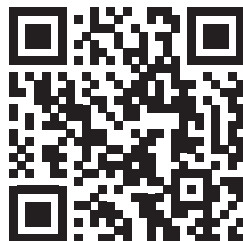
